## Reading 2 Cor 4:3-7 (ERV)

<sup>3</sup> The Good News that we tell people may be hidden, but it is hidden only to those who are lost. <sup>4</sup> The ruler of this world has blinded the minds of those who don't believe. They cannot see the light of the Good News—the message about the divine greatness of Christ. Christ is the one who is exactly like God. <sup>5</sup> We don't tell people about ourselves. But we tell people that Jesus Christ is Lord, and we tell them that we are your servants for Jesus. <sup>6</sup> God once said, "Let light shine out of the darkness!" And this is the same God who made his light shine in our hearts to let us know that his own divine greatness is seen in the face of Christ.

<sup>7</sup> We have this treasure from God, but we are only like clay jars that hold the treasure. This is to show that the amazing power we have is from God, not from us.

#### Reflection

Treasure is often hidden, unseen by many. The objects we treasure are important to us, sometimes their value is obvious, but what is a treasure to one person is often of little importance to another person because of what is unseen. What makes something a treasure to one person is hidden to another unless the person choses to reveal what the object means to them. The memories that a simple object contains can be immense, and it is these unseen memories that make it a treasure.

The people we treasure in our lives because of the relationship we have we them, and the love we share, may be more obvious by our actions.

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Paul says the Good News of Jesus, that He is Lord, is hidden to many, but like the treasure hidden in the field, it is there waiting to be found by any who seek him. Those who find this treasure, and willingly give up all else to have it, live in God's kingdom and the light of God shines within them.

The gospel, the good news of Jesus, is our true treasure and all of us who know Jesus is Lord have this treasure from God within. But Paul says we are like clay jars. Clay jars are ordinary, everyday items usually used for ordinary, everyday things. Like our ordinary plates we use every day, not the best crockery we get out when visitors come! Clay jars are made by a potter for his purpose, the potter moulds the clay for and forms it into the shape he wants. We are made of nothing special, but we are made by God, the potter, for something extraordinarily special. We are a vessel created to be filled by God and to pour out God's love and light to those in need around us. We have a treasure within for sharing with all.

Through the constant use, and occasional accident, everyday plates and jars get chipped or cracked. So too we as clay pots can become chipped, or cracks can appear, through our personal experiences and suffering. It is through these cracks that God's light within us can shine even more strongly. Our treasure within gives us the strength we need in our lives, and we know it is by his amazing power that we live. God choses to put his treasure in us, the clay jars, so that his power and glory shine through our lives and so that others may find the greatest treasure, Jesus, and live in God's kingdom, the kingdom of heaven, here on earth.

Take time to reflect on what it means to you to have this treasure from God within.
